Tourism Statistics Summary

August 2025 ARRIVAL ANALYSIS

Visitors - ↑ 12.8%

Tourists - $\sqrt{-7.1\%}$ Excursionists - $\frac{4}{31.0\%}$

OVERVIEW

August's 2025 visitor arrivals to the shores of Anguilla numbered 17,905; an increase of 12.8% over its corresponding August 2024 figure of 15,869. The total visitor arrivals in the period under review is registered as the highest number of arrivals for any August period spanning from 1993 – 2025. The years 2017 and 2015 followed, registering the second (17,588) and third (17,319) highest totals respectively.

The increase in visitor arrivals for the period August 2025 was synonymous with arrivals of day-trippers to the island, as stayover visitors recorded a decrease in its comparative figures. The majority, 99.0% of the visitor arrivals, came with the intention of vacationing, while 1.0% came with the intention of doing business.




Figure 1: Visitor Arrivals, August 2016 - 2025

PASSENGER MOVEMENT

Passenger arrivals (including both residents and visitors) for August 2025 totalled 25,794, an increase of 10.5% over the corresponding August 2024 figure of 23,353 passengers.

The seaports recorded the higher number of inward passenger movement with 23,006 (89.2%) of total passengers, of which 18,450 (80.2%) entered via the Blowing Point terminal and 4,556 (19.8%) via the Road Bay port. The Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport welcomed 2,788 (10.8%) of the total passengers.

Passenger departures for August 2025 recorded an increase over the corresponding 2024 figure of 26,482 passengers by 9.1%, registering 28,889 outbound passengers.

Passenger departures via the seaports of Anguilla numbered 25,043 (86.7%), of which 20,422 (81.5%) left through the Blowing Point terminal and 4,621 (18.5%) via the Road Bay port. The Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport facilitated 3,846 (13.3%) of the total departures from Anguilla.

TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors)

August's tourist (stay-over visitors) arrivals to Anguilla for 2025 numbered 7,026; with a decrease of 7.1% over its corresponding August 2024 figure of 7,563 arrivals. This period under review registered the fourth highest number of tourist arrivals for any August period when reviewing data spanning from 1993 – 2025. The highest total number of tourist arrivals was recorded in 2019 with 8,903 followed by the years 2024 and 2017 with, 7,563 and 7,428 respectively. Tourist arrivals for this period under review represents

39.2% of total visitor arrivals. Anguilla welcomed 85,393

tourists for the year 2025 thus far.




Figure 2: Tourist Arrivals, August 1993-2025

TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors) continued

The average intended length of stay of tourists in Anguilla for the period under review was 6.6 days; a decrease from the 6.8 days recorded in August 2024. The majority of tourists, 40.5% intended to spend 4-7 days in Anguilla, while 36.5% of tourists planned to stay 1-3 days, followed by 13.7% who stated they intended to stay 8-15 days. The remaining tourists 7.7% and 1.6% intended to stay 23 or more days and 16-22 days respectively.




Figure 3: Tourist Arrivals by Length of Stay, August 2025

A review of the source markets for August 2025, from which the 7,026 tourists visiting Anguilla originated, showed that six (6) source markets registered decreases over their 2024 corresponding figures. Anguilla's main source market, the 'USA' accounted for the majority, 46.8% (3,290) of the tourist arrivals, a decrease of 16.3% over the corresponding August 2024 figure. The 'Caribbean' and 'Dutch West Indies' markets followed with shares of 17.7% (1,246) and 9.5% (670) of tourist arrivals respectively. The largest decline was recorded by the 'Canadian' Market with 22.3%. The increases were recorded in the 'Italian', 'Other', 'Dutch West Indies' and 'Caribbean' markets.




Figure 4: Tourist Arrivals by Source Market, August 2024 and 2025

EXCURSIONISTS (Day Trippers)

Excursionist arrivals for the month under review numbered 10,879, an increase of 31.0% over the corresponding August 2024 figure of 8,306 arrivals. This was the second highest number of excursionists to Anguilla when reviewing data spanning 1993-2025. The highest number of excursionist arrivals was recorded in 2015 with 11,656 arrivals and the third highest total in 2014 of 10,475 arrivals. Excursionist arrivals represent 60.8% of total visitor arrivals.

A review of the excursionist numbers for August 2025 shows that nine (9) source markets registered increases over their respective 2024 total. The majority, 64.5% of the excursionist arrivals, 7,020 were from the 'USA' source market, this represented a 46.3% increase over its corresponding 2024 figure. The 'Other European' and the 'Caribbean' markets followed with shares of 12.2% (1,324) and 6.6% (717) respectively. The sole decline was recorded by the 'Italian' market of 26.8%.




Figure 6: Excursionist Arrivals by Country of Residence, August 2024 and 2025
