Tourism Statistics Summary July 2025

July 2025/24 **ARRIVAL ANALYSIS**

> Visitors: **↑**21.5% Tourists: ↑ 4.2%

Excursionists: ↑40.4%

OVERVIEW

July's 2025 visitor arrivals to Anguilla numbered 22,561 arrivals to its shores; an increase of 21.5% over its corresponding July 2024 figure of 18,567. July 2025 recorded the highest number of visitor arrivals, for any July period, to Anguilla over the past 33 years. The second highest number of visitor arrivals in July was 19,092, recorded in 2017, followed by the third highest of 18,913 arrivals in 2016.

Tourist and excursionist arrivals experienced increases when compared to their respective total in 2024, contributing to this overall increase in visitors.

The majority (99.1%) of the visitors during this period came with the intention of vacationing, while 0.9% came for business.




Figure 1: Visitor Arrivals, July 2016 – 2025

PASSENGER MOVEMENT

m assenger}$ arrivals, which include both visitors and residents for July 2025, increased by 19.5% over July 2024 of 25,450 arrivals to 30,423.

Anguilla's inward passenger movement by sea totalled 24,607 (80.9%) of total passenger arrivals. The Blowing Point terminal welcomed 19,033 (77.3%) of the passenger arrivals who came by sea and the remaining 5,574 (22.7%) arriving at the Sandy Ground terminal. Passenger arrivals by air into the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport accounted for 5,816 (19.1%) of total passenger arrivals.

Departing passenger numbers recorded an increase of 21.6% over the July 2024 figure of 24,368 to 29,626 in July 2025.

Of the three ports of exit, the two seaports cumulatively accounted for 23,954 (80.9%) of all departures, with the Blowing Point terminal facilitating the movement of 18,490 (77.2%) and Sandy Ground 5,464 (22.8%) passengers.

By air, 5,672 (19.1%) of total passengers departing Anguilla exited through the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport.

TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors)

 $\mathcal{T}_{ ext{ourists}}$ (stay-over visitors) to Anguilla for July 2025 totaled 10,080, an increase of 4.2% over the corresponding 2024 figure of 9,675. A review of the data as far back as 1993 shows that the number of tourist arrivals for July 2025 ranked the highest for any July period. The second highest recorded number of tourists for July was registered in 2024, followed by the third highest number of tourists being recorded in 2016 with 9,675 and 9,512 arrivals respectively.

The total number of tourist arrivals for the July 2025 represented a 44.7% share of Anguilla's total visitor arrivals. Anguilla has welcomed 78,367 tourists to the island thus far for 2025.




Figure 2: Tourist Arrivals, July 1993 – 2025

Tourists (Stay-Over Visitors) continued

The intended average length of stay of tourists for July 2025 decreased to 7.1 days from the 7.2 days in July 2024. Majority of tourist arrivals; 50.1% intended to stay for 4 to 7 days, followed by 26.2% of whom intended to stay for 1 to 3 days, 13.6% intended to stay for 8 to 15 days, 7.9% intended to stay for 23 or more days and 2.2% indicated 16 to 22 days.




Figure 3: Tourist Arrivals by Intended Length of Stay, July 2025

A review of the ten (10) source markets from which the 10,080 tourists to Anguilla originated, showed eight (8) of the source markets recording an increase. The largest number of arrivals recorded was from Anguilla's main source market, the 'USA', with a 65.6% (6,610) share of the total. The 'Caribbean' and 'Other Europe' source markets followed with shares of 10.9% (1,095) and 6.2% (628) respectively. The 'Other Europe' market recorded the largest percentage increase over its 2024 figure with 48.5%. The source markets that showed decreases were the 'Canadian' and 'U.K.' markets, with decreases of 16.6% and 13.0% respectively.




Figure 4: Tourist Arrivals by Country of Residence, July 2024 & 2025

EXCURSIONISTS (Day Trippers)

Excursionist arrivals for this period under review, July 2025 totaled 12,481, an increase of 40.4% over the corresponding July 2024 figure of 8,892 arrivals. This figure under review was recorded as the highest ranked July for the number of excursionist arrivals over the past 33 years, for which there is data. The second and third ranked July figures were recorded in the years 2017 and 2015 with 11,008 and 10,950 arrivals respectively. This type of visitor accounted for 55.3% of total visitors to the island during this period.

A review of data for this type of visitor showed that seven (7) source markets showed increases. The largest percentage share, 71.4% of excursionist arrivals, during this period under review, originated out of the 'USA', with 8,913. The 'Other European' and 'Canadian' markets followed with respective shares of 8.2% (1,022) and 6.4% (801). The declines in this type of visitor were recorded by the 'Caribbean', 'French and Dutch West Indies' markets with decreases of 23.0%, 21.7% and 20.2% respectively.




Figure 6: Excursionist Arrivals by Country of Residence, July 2024 & 2025
