

GOVERNMENT OF ANGUILLA Anguilla Statistics Department Tourism Statistics Summary May 2025

May 2025/24 ARRIVAL ANALYSIS

Visitors: ↑ 3.4%
Tourists: ↓-4.0%

Excursionists: ↑12.6%

OVERVIEW

May's 2025 visitor arrivals to Anguilla numbered 18,731 arrivals to its shores; an increase of 3.4% over its corresponding May 2024 figure of 18,116. May 2025 recorded the highest number of arrivals, for any May period, to Anguilla over the past 33 years. The second highest total number of visitor arrivals was 18,116 recorded in 2024, followed by the third highest of 14,339 arrivals in 2017.

The tourists component of total visitor arrivals experienced a decline when compared to their respective total in 2024, while on the contrary, the excursionists component of the showed an increase over the May 2024 total.

The majority (98.8%) of the visitors during this period came with the intention of vacationing, while 1.2% came for




Figure 1: Visitor Arrivals, May 2016 – 2025

PASSENGER MOVEMENT

Passenger arrivals, which include both visitors and residents for May 2025, increased 3.9% over the May 2024 of 24,648 arrivals to 25,608.

Anguilla's inward passenger movement by sea totalled 20,660 (80.7%) of total passenger arrivals. The Blowing Point terminal welcomed 16,757 (81.1%) of the passenger arrivals who came by sea and the remaining 3,903 (18.9%) arriving at the Sandy Ground terminal. Passenger arrivals by air into the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport accounted for 4,948 (19.3%) of total passenger arrivals.

 \mathcal{D} eparting passenger numbers recorded an increase of 7.3% over the May 2024 figure of 23,923 to 25,672 in May 2025.

Of the three ports of exit, the two seaports cumulatively accounted for 20,793 (81.0%) of all departures, with the Blowing Point terminal facilitating the movement of 16,865 (81.1%) and Sandy Ground 3,928 (18.9%) passengers.

By air, 4,879 (19.0%) of total passengers departing Anguilla exited through the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport.

TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors)

Tourists (stay-over visitors) to Anguilla for May 2025 totaled 9,669, a decrease of 4.0% over the corresponding 2024 figure of 10,068. A review of the data as far back as 1993 shows that the number of tourist arrivals for May 2025 ranked the second highest for any May period. The highest recorded number of tourists was registered in 2024, followed by the third highest number of tourists being recorded in 2019 with 10,068 and 8,166 arrivals respectively.

The total number of tourist arrivals for the May 2025 represented a 51.6% share of Anguilla's total visitor arrivals. Anguilla has welcomed 58,489 tourists to the island thus far for 2025.




Figure 2: Tourist Arrivals, May 1993 - 2025

Tourists (Stay-Over Visitors) continued

The intended average length of stay of tourists for May 2025 decreased to 5.8 days from the 6.0 days in May 2024. The majority of tourist arrivals; 52.3% intended to stay for 4 to 7 days, followed by 32.6% of whom intended to stay for 1 to 3 days, 9.9% intended to stay for 8 to 15 days, 4.2% intended to stay for 23 or more days and 0.9% indicated 16 to 22 days.




Figure 3: Tourist Arrivals by Intended Length of Stay, May 2025

A review of the ten (10) source markets from which the 9,669 tourists to Anguilla originated, showed seven (7) of the source markets each recorded a decline. The largest number of arrivals recorded was from Anguilla's main source market, the 'USA', with a 76.1% (7,358) share of the total. This market also recorded a decline of 0.6% over its May 2024 figure. The 'Caribbean' and 'Other Europe' source markets followed with shares of 5.1% (496) and 4.5% (436) respectively. The source markets that showed increases were the 'Canadian', 'Other Europe' and 'French West Indies' markets, with increases of 6.5%, 18.8% and 15.8% respectively.




Figure 4: Tourist Arrivals by Country of Residence, May 2024 & 2025

EXCURSIONISTS (Day Trippers)

Excursionist arrivals for this period under review, May 2025 totaled 9,062, an increase of 12.6% over the corresponding May 2024 figure of 8,048 arrivals. This figure under review was recorded the highest ranked May number of excursionist arrivals total for any May period within the past 33 years, for which there is data. The second and third ranked May figures were recorded in the years 2024 and 2014 with 8,048 and 7,715 arrivals respectively. This type of visitor accounted for 48.4% of total visitors to the island during this period.




Figure 5: Excursionist Arrivals, May 1993 - 2025

A review of data for this type of visitor showed that nine (9) source markets showed increases. The largest percentage share, 61.9% of excursionist arrivals, during this period under review, originated out of the 'USA', with 5,608. The 'Other European' and 'Canadian' markets followed with respective shares of 11.3% (1,021) and 6.5% (591). The decline was recorded by the 'Dutch West Indies' market with 3.0%, but contributed a share of 5.0% to arrivals.




Figure 6: Excursionist Arrivals by Country of Residence, May 2024 & 2025
