What is Trade?

Trade by definition is the commercial exchange (buying and selling of goods on domestic or international markets) of services and imports are the total value of the goods and services that people in one country buy from people in other countries.

Anguilla's main trading partners

Anguilla's main trading partners are North America, Caricom countries, United Kingdom, St. Martin/St. Maarten and Puerto Rico.

Imports by Region

Imports from Caricom countries amounted to EC \$30.1 million in 2004, while imports from North America amounted to EC\$144.7 million in 2004. North America is Anguilla's largest trading partner accounting for 52 percent of total trade for 2004.

Imports from Canada made up 1.0 percent of overall trade and trade with this country rose by 6.2 percent for 2004 compared to 2003.

Trade with the United Kingdom showed a very significant increase in the value of goods imported from EC\$2.7 million in 2003 to EC\$15.4 million in 2004 accounting for 6 percent of total trade.

In 2004 the total value of goods imported to Anguilla amounted to EC\$276.5 million, an increase of 33.4 percent over the 2003 total value of goods imported.

Around 90% of Anguilla's food and other products are imported. In Anguilla import duty on food products ranges from 5 percent to 20 percent
