ANGUILLA'S POPULATION

This article was created by the Anguilla Statistics Department (ASD), in recognition of World Population Day, which is celebrated every year, on the 11th day of July. World Population Day, seeks to raise awareness of global population issues. This article provides a statistical summary of Anguilla's population, by sex and district. This article is an excerpt from the results of the Anguilla Population and Housing Census, 2011, published by the ASD.

FIG. 1: ANGUILLA'S POPULATION BY SEX, IN 2011




Figure 1 shows the proportion of males and females in Anguilla. Findings from the Anguilla Population and Housing Census (AP&HC) 2011 indicated that the enumerated population from the data collection stage using the questionnaire was 13,572 persons, of which 6,707 or 49.42% were males and the remaining 6,865 or 50.58% were females; a sex ratio of 97.70, that is, for every 97 males there were 100 females or for every 1 male there were 1.02 females. The deficit of males as a percentage of the total population amounted to 1.16%.

FIG. 2: ANGUILLA'S POPULATION BY DISTRICT AND SEX, IN 2011




Figure 2 shows Anguilla's population by sex and district. The sex ratio for some districts in Anguilla were noted to vary from the national ratio. The districts of West End, North Hill, The Farrington, East End and Island Harbour registered ratios of 107.03, 108.45, 100.32, 111.86 and 105.33 respectively; all above 100.00 and that of the national ratio. The calculated sex ratio indicated that there were more men than women in these districts. The districts of Sandy Hill, Stoney Ground, North Side, The Valley, George Hill, Sandy Ground and Blowing Point all registered ratios below that of the national figure, signifying that there were less males than females in these districts.
