OVERVIEW

July's 2021 visitor arrivals data showed that 4,889 persons graced Anguilla's shores. This figure represents an increase over its corresponding July 2020 figure of four (4) arrivals. Over the past 29 years, for which there is data for any 'July' period; 2020 registered the lowest number of visitors, followed by 2021. As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to affect the world, Anguilla has welcomed 13,222 arrivals for 2021 to date, with this period under review recording the highest number of arrivals followed by March 2021 with 2,405 visitors.

The majority; 98.0% (4,789) of the visitor arrivals, came with the intention of vacationing, while 2.0% (100) came with the intention of doing business.




Figure 1: Visitor Arrivals: July 2011 – 2021

PASSENGER MOVEMENT

Passenger arrivals, which include both visitors and residents for this period under review, totaled 5,843, an increase from 123 over the corresponding 2020 period's figure. Anguilla's inward passenger movement by sea numbered 4,550 (77.9%) of total arrivals; of which 99.6% of passenger arrivals entered via the Blowing Point terminal and the remaining 16 (0.4%) entered via the Sandy Ground port. Passenger arrivals by air at the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport accounted for 1,293 (22.1%) of total passenger arrivals.

Departing passengers also experienced an increase, but with a lower number, moving from a total of 250 in July 2020 to 5,104 in July 2021.

Outward passenger movement via the sea accounted for 3,887 (76.2%), of all departures. The majority of the passenger departures were facilitated through a seaport with the Blowing Point terminal saw 3,869 (99.5%) of total departures by sea and 18 (0.5%) passengers departed via the Sandy Ground port.

By air, 1,217 (23.8%) passengers departed Anguilla through the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport.

TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors)

Tourists (stay-over visitors) to Anguilla for the month of July 2021 totaled 4,884, an increase over its corresponding July 2020 total of 4 tourists. Data for any 'July' period as far back as 1993, shows that tourist arrivals dropped from the second highest recorded figure in July 2019 of 8,852 to an all-time low of 4 arrivals in July 2020, followed by the second lowest figure recorded during this period under review.

For 2021 to date, Anguilla has welcomed 8,322 tourists. The highest monthly total of tourist arrivals for 2021 was recorded in this month under review. The lowest was recorded in May with 601, which was accumulated in 7 days

due to the borders being temporarily closed from April 22 to May 25 2021.




Figure 2: Tourist Arrivals, July 1993 – 2021

Tourists (Stay-Over Visitors) *continued*

The intended average length of stay for tourists decreased to 8.0 days from the 23.0 days in July 2020. The majority of tourist arrivals during this period under review, with more than half of the arrivals, 60.7% intended to stay for 4 to 7 days, followed by 22.6% of whom intended to stay for between 8 to 15 days. 8.0% intended to stay for 1 to 3 days, 6.2% for 23 or more days and 2.5% indicated 16 to 22 days.




Figure 3: Tourist Arrivals by intended Length of Stay, July 2021

A review of the ten source markets from which the 4,884 tourists to Anguilla originated, showed that all ten sources markets contributed to this overall figure. Anguilla’s main tourist source market, the USA accounted for the majority of arrivals, with an 87.3% (4,264) share of this market. The ‘U.K.’, ‘Other’ and the ‘Caribbean’ source markets follow with shares of 3.4%, 2.4% and 2.3% respectively. Additionally, the ‘USA’ and the ‘Caribbean’ markets were the only source markets that recorded arrivals during the corresponding July 2020 period with each market recording two persons.




Figure 4: Tourist Arrivals by Country of Residence July 2020 & 2021

EXCURSIONISTS (Day Trippers)

For this month under review, there were five (5) recorded excursionist arrivals, in comparison to no arrivals a year ago, in the 2020’s corresponding period. Arrivals of this type of visitor were significantly impacted since the COVID-19 pandemic, as this type of visitor to Anguilla is usually a tourist visiting St. Maarten/St. Martin who travels to Anguilla on a day trip to enjoy our beaches and hospitality for a day. Anguilla has implemented precautionary measures to ensure the safety of its inhabitants with mandatory screening and a quarantine period, which may have inhibited day-trippers from visiting.





Figure 5: Excursionist Arrivals, July 1993 – 2021
