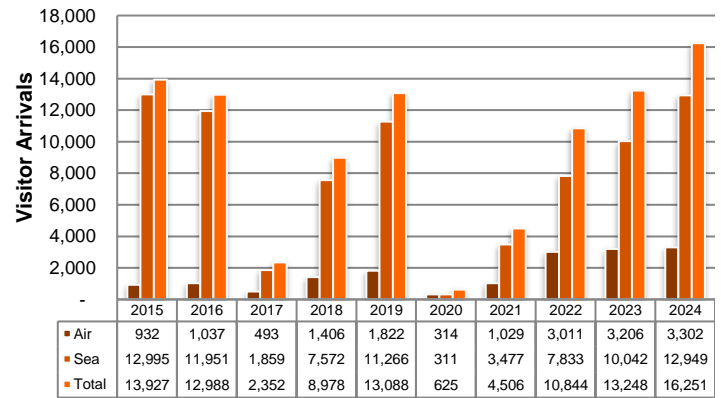
OVERVIEW

November's 2024 visitor arrivals data showed that 16,251 visitors graced Anguilla's shores; an increase of 22.7% over its corresponding November 2023 figure of 13,248. November 2024 recorded the highest number of arrivals, for any November period, to Anguilla over the past 32 years. The second highest total number of visitor arrivals was 14,010 recorded in 2006, followed by the third highest of 13,927 arrivals in 2015. Anguilla has welcomed 182,625 visitors for the year 2024 thus far.

The increase in visitor arrivals for this period under review was positively impacted by the arrivals from both types of visitors; tourists (stay-overs) and excursionists (day-trippers).

The majority (98.8%) of the visitors during this period came

with the intention of vacationing, while 1.2% came for business.

PASSENGER MOVEMENT

Passenger arrivals, which include both visitors and residents for November 2024, increased by 18.4% to 21,986 from the 18,575 arrivals in November 2023.

Anguilla's inward passenger movement by sea totalled 17,891 (81.4%) of total passenger arrivals. The Blowing Point terminal welcomed 14,024 (78.4%) of the passenger arrivals who came by sea and the remainder 3,867 (21.6%) arrived at the Sandy Ground terminal. Passenger arrivals by air into the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport accounted for 4,095 (18.6%) of total passenger arrivals.

Departing passenger numbers recorded an increase of 18.4% over the November 2023 figure of 17,642 to 20,892 in November 2024.

Of the three ports of exit, the two seaports cumulatively accounted for 17,363 (83.1%) of all departures, with the Blowing Point terminal facilitating the movement of 13,524 (77.9%) and Sandy Ground 3,839 (22.1%) passengers.

By air, 3,529 (16.9%) of total passengers departing Anguilla exited through the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport.

TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors)

Tourists (stay-over visitors) to Anguilla for November 2024 totalled 9,342, an increase of 13.1% over the corresponding 2023 figure of 8,260. A review of the data as far back as 1993 shows that tourist arrivals for November 2024 ranked the highest for any November period, with the second highest number of tourists recorded in 2023. This ranking followed by 7,603 and 7,196 arrivals in 2019 and 2022 respectively.

The total number tourist arrivals for November 2024 represented a 57.5% share of Anguilla's total visitors.

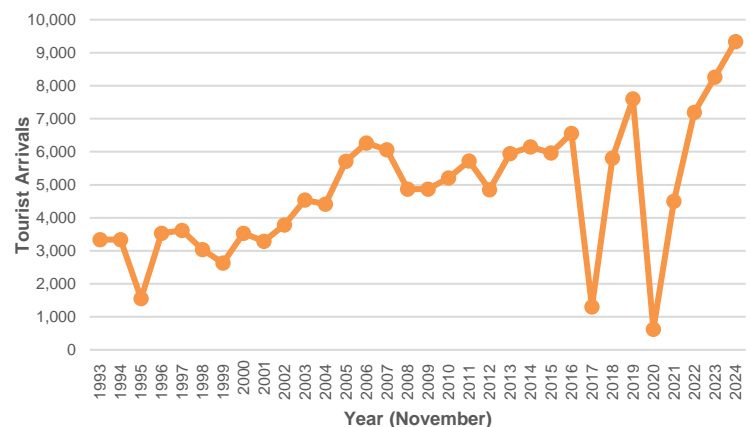


Figure 2: Tourist Arrivals, November 1993 – 2024

Tourists (Stay-Over Visitors) *continued*

The intended average length of stay of tourists for November 2024 decreased to 6.2 days from the 6.4 days in November 2023. The majority of tourist arrivals; 52.5% intended to stay for 4 to 7 days, followed by 29.1% of whom intended to stay for 1 to 3 days, 12.7% intended to stay for 8 to 15 days, 4.3% intended to stay for 23 or more days and 1.3% indicated 16 to 22 days.

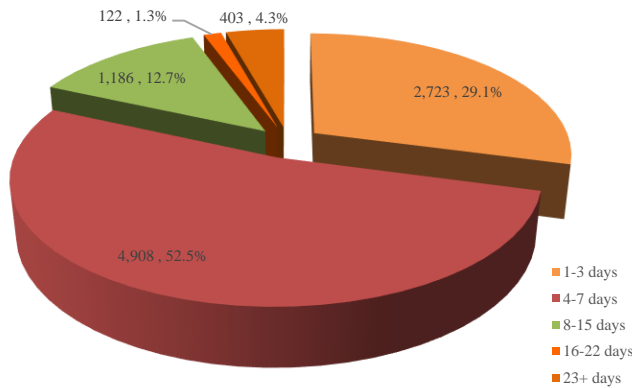


Figure 3: Tourist Arrivals by Intended Length of Stay, November 2024

A review of the ten (10) source markets from which the 9,342 tourists to Anguilla originated, showed eight (8) of the source markets contributed to the 13.1% increase while two (2) reported declines. The largest contributing number of arrivals recorded was from Anguilla’s main source market the ‘USA’, with a 73.0% (6,819) share of the total tourist markets. The ‘Canada’ and ‘Caribbean’ source markets followed with 5.4% (508) and 4.7% (435) share respectively. The source markets that had the opposite effect on this overall increase in percentage terms were the ‘U.K.’ and ‘Canada’ markets, with recorded declines of 9.2% and 7.0% respectively.

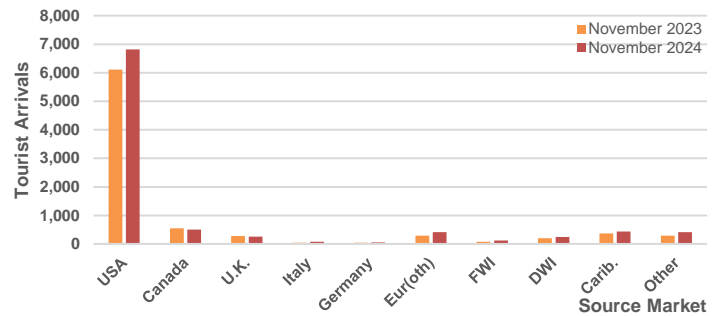


Figure 4: Tourist Arrivals by Country of Residence, November 2023 & 2024

EXCURSIONISTS (Day Trippers)

Excursionist arrivals for this period under review, November 2024 totaled 6,909, an increase of 38.5% over the corresponding November 2023 figure of 4,988 arrivals. This figure under review was recorded the fifth (5th) highest ranked November excursionist arrivals total for any November period within the past 32 years, for which there is data. The highest ranked November figure was recorded in the year 2015 with 7,964 arrivals. This type of visitor accounted for 42.5% of total visitors to the island during this period.

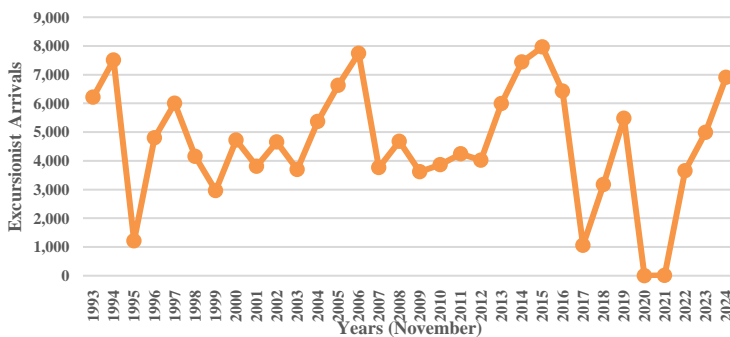


Figure 5: Excursionist Arrivals, November 1993 - 2024

A review of data for this type of visitor showed that all ten (10) source markets contributed to this overall increase. The largest percentage share of excursionist arrivals, during this period under review, originated out of the ‘USA’ with 58.7% (4,053) of these arrivals. The ‘Other European’ and ‘Canadian’ markets followed with respective shares of 13.7% (944) and 10.5% (722). The largest recorded increase over their corresponding 2023 figures in percentage terms were recorded by the ‘UK’ and ‘Italian’ markets with 95.7% and 64.5% respectively.

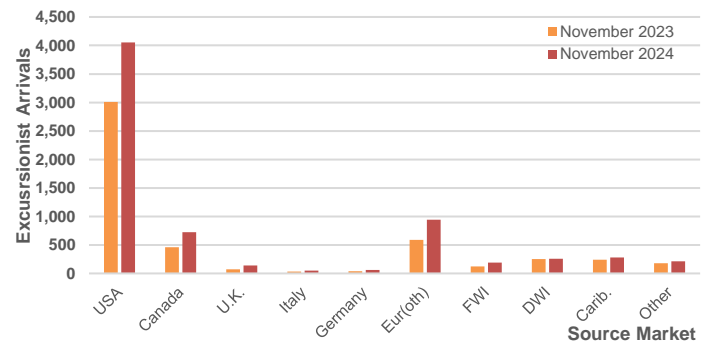


Figure 6: Excursionist Arrivals by Country of Residence, November 2023 & 2024
