



Tourism Statistics Summary

February 2025

OVERVIEW

February's 2025 visitor arrivals to the shores of Anguilla numbered 23,086; an increase of 18.3% over its corresponding February 2024 figure of 19,512. This figure under review is registered as the highest number of arrivals for any February period spanning from 1993 – 2025. The years 2024 and 2015 followed registering the second highest (19,512) and third highest (18,111) totals respectively.

The increase in visitor arrivals for the period February 2025 was due to the increase in arrivals for both; stay-overs and day-trippers, to the island. The majority; 99.3% of the visitor arrivals, came with the intention of vacationing, while 0.7% came with the intention of doing

business.




Figure 1: Visitor Arrivals, February 2016 - 2025

PASSENGER MOVEMENT

Passenger arrivals (including both residents and visitors) for February 2025 totalled 31,660, an increase of 27.5% over the corresponding February 2024 figure of 24,834 passengers.

The seaports recorded the higher number of inward passenger movement with 25,640 (81.0%) of total passengers, of which 15,282 (59.6%) entered via the Blowing Point terminal and 10,358 (40.4%) via the Road Bay port. The Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport welcomed 6,020 (19.0%) of the total passengers.

Passenger departures for February 2025 recorded an increase over its corresponding 2024 figure of 24,806 passengers with 17.2%, registering 29,061 outbound passengers.

Passenger departures via the seaports of Anguilla numbered 23,283 (80.1%), of which 14,955 (64.2%) left through the Blowing Point terminal and 8,328 (35.8%) via the Road Bay port. The Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport facilitated 5,778 (19.9%) of the total departures from Anguilla.

TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors)

February's tourist (stay-over visitors) arrivals to Anguilla for 2025 numbered 11,891; with an increase of 3.6% over its corresponding February 2024 figure of 11,474 arrivals. This period under review registered the highest figure for any February period when reviewing data spanning from 1993 – 2025. February 2024 followed with the second highest total of tourist arrivals with 11,474 and February 2023 with 10,423 arrivals being the third highest total of this type of arrivals.

Tourist arrivals for February 2025 represents 51.5% of total visitor arrivals. Anguilla welcomed 24,703 tourists for the year of 2025 thus far.




Figure 2: Tourist Arrivals, February 1993–2025

TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors) *continued*

The average intended length of stay of tourists in Anguilla for the period under review was 6.6 days; an increase from the 6.5 days recorded in February 2024. The majority of tourists, 54.0% intended to spend 4-7 days in Anguilla, while 24.7% of tourists planned to stay 1-3 days, followed by 15.0% who stated they intended to stay 8-15 days. The remaining tourists 4.2% and 2.0% intended to stay 23 or more days and 16-22 days respectively.




Figure 3: Tourist Arrivals by Length of Stay, February 2025

A review of the source markets for February 2025, from which the 11,891 tourists visiting Anguilla originated, showed that seven (7) source markets registered increases over their 2024 corresponding figures. Anguilla’s main source market, the ‘USA’ accounted for majority, 72.5% (8,616) of the tourist arrivals; an increase of 1.3% over the corresponding February 2024 figure. The ‘Other Europe’ and ‘Canadian’ markets followed with shares of 7.5% (892) and 5.4% (640) of tourists arrivals respectively. The markets that recorded declines in percentage terms, over their corresponding February 2024 figures were the ‘Canadian’, ‘Caribbean’ and ‘Other’ markets with 2.0%, 6.6% and 12.6% respectively.




Figure 4: Tourist Arrivals by Source Market, February 2024 and 2025

EXCURSIONISTS (Day Trippers)

Excursionist arrivals for the month under review numbered 11,195, an increase of 39.3% over its corresponding February 2024 figure of 8,038 arrivals. This figure under review is the highest number of arrivals for this type of visitor spanning from 1993 – 2025. The second highest was recorded in 2015 with 10,716 arrivals. Excursionist arrivals represents 48.5% of visitor arrivals. Anguilla welcomed 21,931 day-trippers to the island in the year of 2025 thus far.




Figure 5: Excursionist Arrivals, February 1993 – 2025

A review of the excursionist numbers for February 2024 shows that eight (8) out of the ten (10) source markets registered increases over their respective 2024 total. The majority, 56.2% of the excursionist arrivals were from the ‘USA’ source market; accounting for 6,294 of the excursionist arrivals. The ‘Other European’ and ‘Canadian’ markets followed with shares of 18.2% (2,043) and 10.1% (1,126) respectively.




Figure 6: Excursionist Arrivals by Country of Residence, February 2024 and 2025
