ARRIVAL ANALYSIS

Visitors: \uparrow 16.0%

Tourists: \uparrow 7.2%

Excursionists: \uparrow 27.9%

OVERVIEW

November's 2025 visitor arrivals to Anguilla's shores numbered 18,848 arrivals; an increase of 16.0% over its corresponding November 2024 figure of 16,251. This period under review is recorded as the highest number of arrivals, for any November period, to Anguilla over the past 33 years. The second highest total number of visitor arrivals was recorded in 2024 with 16,251 and the third highest of 14,010 arrivals in 2006.

This overall increase in visitor arrivals was due to both categories of visitors; stayover and day-trippers, recording increases when compared to their respective totals in 2024.

The majority (98.6%) of the visitors during this period came with the intention of vacationing, while 1.4% came for business.




Figure 1: Visitor Arrivals, November 2016 – 2025

PASSENGER MOVEMENT

Passenger arrivals, which include both visitors and residents for November 2025, increased by 16.2% over its November 2024 figure of 21,986 arrivals to 25,554.

Anguilla's inward passenger movement by sea totalled 20,591 (80.6%) of total passenger arrivals. The Blowing Point terminal welcomed 15,692 (76.2%) of the passenger arrivals who came by sea and the remaining 4,899 (23.8%) arriving at the Sandy Ground terminal. Passenger arrivals by air via Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport accounted for 4,963 (19.4%) of total passenger arrivals.

Departing passenger numbers recorded an increase of 16.9% over the November 2024 figure of 20,892 to 24,433 in November 2025.

Of the three ports of exit, the two seaports cumulatively accounted for 19,836 (81.2%) of all departures, with the Blowing Point terminal facilitating the movement of 15,133 (76.3%) and Sandy Ground 4,703 (23.7%) passengers.

By air, 4,597 (18.8%) of total passengers departing Anguilla exited through the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport.

Tourists (Stay-Over Visitors)

Tourists (stay-over visitors) to Anguilla for November 2025 totaled 10,013, an increase of 7.2% over the corresponding 2024 figure of 9,342. A review of the data as far back as 1993 shows that the number of tourist arrivals for November 2025 ranked the highest for any November period. The second highest recorded number of tourists was registered in 2024 with 9,342 and the third highest in 2023 with 8,260 arrivals.

The total number of tourist arrivals for the November 2025 represented a 53.1% share of Anguilla's total visitor arrivals. Anguilla has welcomed 100,490 tourists thus far for the year.




Figure 2: Tourist Arrivals, November 1993 – 2025

Tourists (Stay-Over Visitors) *continued*

The intended average length of stay of tourists for November 2025 was 6.2 days, remaining unchanged from the 6.2 days in November 2024. The majority of tourist arrivals; 57.4% intended to stay for 4 to 7 days, followed by 26.3% intended to stay for 1 to 3 days, 10.7% of whom intended to stay for 8 – 15 days, 4.4% intended to stay for 23 or more days and 1.2% indicated 16 to 22 days.




Figure 3: Tourist Arrivals by Intended Length of Stay, November 2025

A review of the ten (10) source markets from which the 10,013 tourists to Anguilla originated, showed five (5) recorded increases. The largest (36.8%) increase was experienced in the ‘Caribbean’ market followed by the Italian market with an increase of 27.8%. Anguilla’s main source market, the ‘USA’, registered a 6.7% increase a 72.7% (7,276) share of the total. The source markets that showed decreases were the ‘German’ (-13.5%), ‘Other Europe’ (-2.9%), ‘French West Indies’ (-0.8%), ‘Dutch West Indies’ (-7.7%) and ‘Other’ (-11.7%) markets.




Figure 4: Tourist Arrivals by Country of Residence, November 2024 & 2025

EXCURSIONISTS (Day Trippers)

Excursionist arrivals for this period under review, November 2025 totaled 8,835, an increase of 27.9% over the corresponding November 2024 figure of 6,909 arrivals. This figure under review was recorded as the highest ranked November total number of excursionist arrivals for any November period within the past 33 years, for which there is data. The second and third highest November ranked figures were recorded in the years 2015 and 2006 with 7,964 and 7,742 arrivals respectively. This type of visitor accounted for 46.9% of total visitors to the island during this period.




Figure 5: Excursionist Arrivals, November 1993 - 2025

A review of data for this type of visitor showed that all ten (10) source markets showed increases, contributing to the overall increase in the total arrivals for this type of visitor. The largest percentage share, 56.7% (5,012) of excursionist arrivals, during this period under review, originated out of the ‘USA’. The ‘Other Europe’ and ‘Caribbean’ markets followed with respective shares of 13.5% (1,192) and 10.3% (908).




Figure 6: Excursionist Arrivals by Country of Residence, November 2024 & 2025
