



# Tourism Statistics Summary October 2025

ARRIVAL ANALYSIS

## OVERVIEW

October's 2025 visitor arrivals to the shores of Anguilla numbered 8,271; a decrease of 9.2% from its corresponding October 2024 figure of 9,105. The total visitor arrivals for the period under review is registered as the fourth highest number of arrivals for any October period spanning from 1993 – 2025. The years 2024, 1994 and 2016, recorded the highest October totals, ranking first (9,105), second (8,770) and third (8,635) respectively.

The decrease in visitor arrivals for the period October 2025 was due to the decrease in arrival figures from both types of visitors to the island, day-trippers and stayover visitors. The majority, 97.5% of the visitor arrivals, came with the intention of vacationing, while 2.5% came with the intention of doing business.




Figure 1: Visitor Arrivals, October 2016 - 2025

## PASSENGER MOVEMENT

Passenger arrivals (including both residents and visitors) for October 2025 totalled 14,255, a decrease of 6.2% over the corresponding October 2024 figure of 15,190 passengers.

The seaports recorded the higher number of inward passenger movement with 12,407 (87.0%) of total passengers, of which 10,324 (83.2%) entered via the Blowing Point terminal and 2,083 (16.8%) via the Road Bay port. The Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport welcomed 1,848 (13.0%) of the total passengers.

Passenger departures for October 2025 recorded a decline over the corresponding 2024 figure of 13,968 passengers by 6.2%, registering 13,101 outbound passengers.

Passenger departures via the seaports of Anguilla numbered 11,753 (89.7%), of which 9,693 (82.5%) left through the Blowing Point terminal and 2,060 (17.5%) via the Road Bay port. The Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport facilitated 1,348 (10.3%) of the total departures from Anguilla.

## TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors)

October's tourist (stay-over visitors) arrivals to Anguilla for 2025 numbered 3,408; a decrease of 8.7% from its corresponding October 2024 figure of 3,732 arrivals. This period under review registered the second highest number of tourist arrivals for any October period when reviewing data spanning from 1993 – 2025. The highest total number of tourist arrivals in October was recorded in 2024 with 3,732 and the third highest in 2022 with 3,301 arrivals.

Tourist arrivals for this period under review represents 41.2% of total visitor arrivals. Anguilla welcomed 90,477 tourists for the year 2025 thus far.




Figure 2: Tourist Arrivals, October 1993–2025

## TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors) *continued*

The average intended length of stay of tourists in Anguilla for the period under review was 7.7 days; an increase from the 6.9 days recorded in October 2024. The majority of tourists, 39.8% intended to spend 4-7 days in Anguilla, while 33.4% of tourists planned to stay 1-3 days, followed by 13.3% who stated they intended to stay for 23 or more days. The remaining tourists 10.8% and 2.7% intended to stay 8-15 days and 16-22 days respectively.




Figure 3: Tourist Arrivals by Length of Stay, October 2025

A review of the source markets for October 2025, from which the 3,408 tourists visited Anguilla originated, showed that eight (8) source markets registered decreases over their 2024 corresponding figures. Anguilla's main source market, the 'USA' accounted for the majority, 52.3% (1,781) of the tourist arrivals, an increase of 3.7% over the corresponding October 2024 figure. The 'Caribbean' and 'U.K.' markets followed with shares of 16.7% (569) and 7.1% (241) of tourist arrivals respectively. The largest decline was recorded by the 'Dutch West Indies' Market with 56.8%, with a 5.0% share of the market. The increases were recorded in the 'USA' and 'UK' markets.




Figure 4: Tourist Arrivals by Source Market, October 2024 and 2025

## EXCURSIONISTS (Day Trippers)

Excursionist arrivals for the month under review numbered 4,863, a decrease of 9.5% from the corresponding October 2024 figure of 5,373 arrivals. This was the seventh highest number of excursionists to Anguilla when reviewing data spanning 1993-2025. The highest number of excursionist arrivals was recorded in 1994 with 5,875 arrivals, followed by the second and third highest total in 2016 of 5,389 and 2024 with 5,373 arrivals respectively. Excursionist arrivals represent 58.8% of total visitor arrivals.




Figure 5: Excursionist Arrivals, October 1993 – 2025

A review of the excursionist numbers for October 2025 shows that seven (7) source markets registered decreases over their respective 2024 total. The majority, 67.7% (3,293) of the excursionist arrivals were from the 'USA' source market, a 1.1% decline over its corresponding 2024 figure. The 'Other European' and the 'Caribbean' markets followed with shares of 9.2% (446) and 5.6% (273) respectively. The increases were recorded in the 'Canadian' and 'German' markets, while the 'Italian' market remained unchanged.




Figure 6: Excursionist Arrivals by Country of Residence, October 2024 and 2025
