



Tourism Statistics Summary

February 2026

OVERVIEW

February's 2026 visitor arrivals to the shores of Anguilla numbered 27,365, an increase of 18.5% over its corresponding February 2025 figure of 23,086. The total visitor arrivals for the period under review is registered as the highest number of arrivals for any February period spanning from 1993 – 2026. The period, February 2025 followed, recording the second highest number of 23,086 arrivals and the year 2024 recorded the third highest with 19,512 arrivals.

The increase in visitor arrivals for the period February 2026 resulted from an increase in arrival figures from both types of visitors to the island, day-trippers and stay-over visitors. The majority, 98.9% of the visitor arrivals, came with the intention of vacationing, while 1.1% came with the intention of doing business.




Figure 1: Visitor Arrivals, February 2017 - 2026

PASSENGER MOVEMENT

Passenger arrivals (including both residents and visitors) for February 2026 totalled 33,596, an increase of 6.1% over the corresponding February 2025 figure of 31,660 passengers.

The seaports recorded the higher number of inward passenger movement with 26,630 (79.3%) of total passengers, of which 18,119 (68.0%) entered via the Blowing Point terminal and 8,511 (32.0%) via the Road Bay port. The Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport welcomed 6,966 (20.7%) of the total passengers.

Passenger departures for February 2026 recorded an increase over the corresponding 2025 figure of 29,061 passengers by 14.3%, registering 33,231 outbound passengers.

Passenger departures via the seaports of Anguilla numbered 26,337 (79.3%), of which 17,926 (68.1%) left through the Blowing Point terminal and 8,411 (31.9%) via the Road Bay port. The Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport facilitated 6,894 (20.7%) of the total departures from Anguilla.

TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors)

February's tourist (stay-over visitors) arrivals to Anguilla for 2026 numbered 14,992; an increase of 26.1% from its corresponding February 2025 figure of 11,891 arrivals. This period under review registered the highest number of tourist arrivals for any February period when reviewing data spanning from 1993 – 2025. The second and third highest number of tourist arrivals for February were recorded in the year 2025 with 11,891 and in 2024 with 11,474 arrivals respectively. Tourist arrivals for this period under review represents over half of the total visitor arrivals figure with 54.8%.




Figure 2: Tourist Arrivals, February 1993–2026

TOURISTS (Stay-Over Visitors) *continued*

The average intended length of stay of tourists in Anguilla for the period under review was 6.0 days; a decrease from the 6.6 days recorded in February 2025. The majority of tourists, 49.1% intended to spend 4-7 days in Anguilla, while 33.0% of tourists planned to stay 1-3 days, followed by 12.1% who stated they intended to stay for 8-15 days. The remaining tourists 4.0% and 1.8% intended to stay 23 or more days and 16-22 days respectively.




Figure 3: Tourist Arrivals by Length of Stay, February 2026

A review of the source markets for February 2026, from which the 14,992 tourists to Anguilla originated, showed that nine (9) source markets registered increases over their 2025 corresponding figures. Anguilla’s main source market, the ‘USA’ accounted for the majority, 71.7% (10,746) of the tourist arrivals, an increase of 24.7% over the corresponding February 2025 figure. The ‘Canadian’ and ‘Other Europe’ markets followed with shares of 7.0% (1,056) and 6.8% (1,021) of tourist arrivals respectively. The decline in percentage terms of 33.2% was recorded by the ‘Italian’ market, which held a 0.9% (131) share of the tourist market.




Figure 4: Tourist Arrivals by Source Market, February 2025 and 2026

EXCURSIONISTS (Day Trippers)

Excursionist arrivals for the month under review numbered 12,373, an increase of 10.5% over the corresponding February 2025 figure of 11,195 arrivals. This was the highest number of excursionists to Anguilla when reviewing data spanning 1993-2026. The second highest number of excursionist arrivals was recorded in 2025 with 11,195 arrivals, followed by the third highest total in 2015 of 10,716. Excursionist arrivals for this period under review represented 45.2% of total visitor arrivals.




Figure 5: Excursionist Arrivals, February 1993 – 2026

A review of the excursionist numbers for February 2026 shows that seven (7) source markets registered increases over their respective 2025 total. The majority, 61.8% (7,649) of the excursionist arrivals were from the ‘USA’ source market, a 21.5% increase over its corresponding 2025 figure. The ‘Canadian’ and ‘Other European’ markets followed with shares of 11.5% (1,426) and 10.8% (1,333) respectively. The decreases in excursionist arrivals from their February 2025 figures were experienced in the ‘German’ (-49.5%), ‘Other European’ (-34.8%) and ‘Italian’ (-14.8%) markets.




Figure 6: Excursionist Arrivals by Country of Residence, February 2025 and 2026
